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1 Getting Started

1.1 Overview

The Plugin modifies and enhances default WP login forms and adds redirect, captcha, email template and access control options.

1.2 Installation

1.2.1 File Structure

Extract (Unzip) the plugin download package. Within the download package you'll find the following file structure and contents:

- pa_login.zip (Installable plugin zip file)
- pa_login (Plugin folder for FTP upload)
- login_plugin_manual.pdf (PDF User Documentation)

1.2.2 WordPress Installation

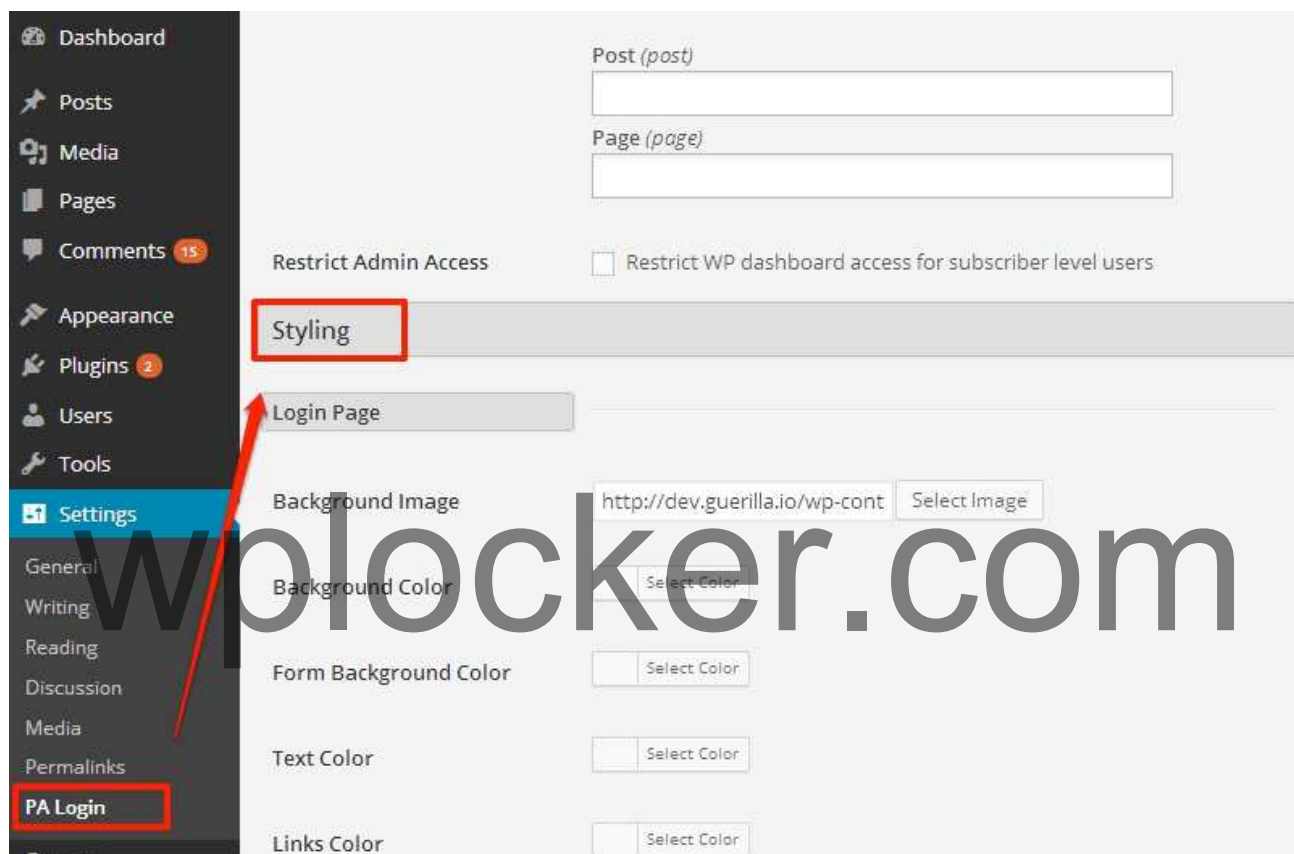
1. Go to **Plugins > Add New**.
2. Under **Upload**, click **Browse**, locate *pa_login.zip* in your plugin download package and click **Open**.
3. Find the WordPress Plugin you wish to install.
4. Click **Install Now** to install the WordPress Plugin.
5. A popup window will ask you to confirm your wish to install the Plugin.
6. If this is the first time you've installed a WordPress Plugin, you may need to enter the FTP login credential information. If you've installed a Plugin before, it will still have the login information. This information is available through your web server host.
7. Click **Proceed** to continue with the installation. The resulting installation screen will list the installation as successful or note any problems during the install.
8. If successful, click **Activate Plugin** to activate it.

1.2.3 FTP Installation

1. Using a FTP program, upload the plugin folder *pa_login* located in your plugin download package folder.
2. Go to Plugins screen and find the newly uploaded **PA Login & Access** plugin in the list.
3. Click **Activate Plugin** to activate it.

2 Style default WP Login

You can style default WP login page under **Settings > Pa Login & Access > Styling > Login Page**. Customize the look of the forms and background.



3 Add login, register and forgotten forms to a page

3.1 Add forms using shortcodes

You can add login forms to a page using the following shortcodes:

- **[pa_login]**
- **[pa_register]**
- **[pa_forgotten]**

3.2 Add forms using PHP code

Add the following PHP function within your page template file:

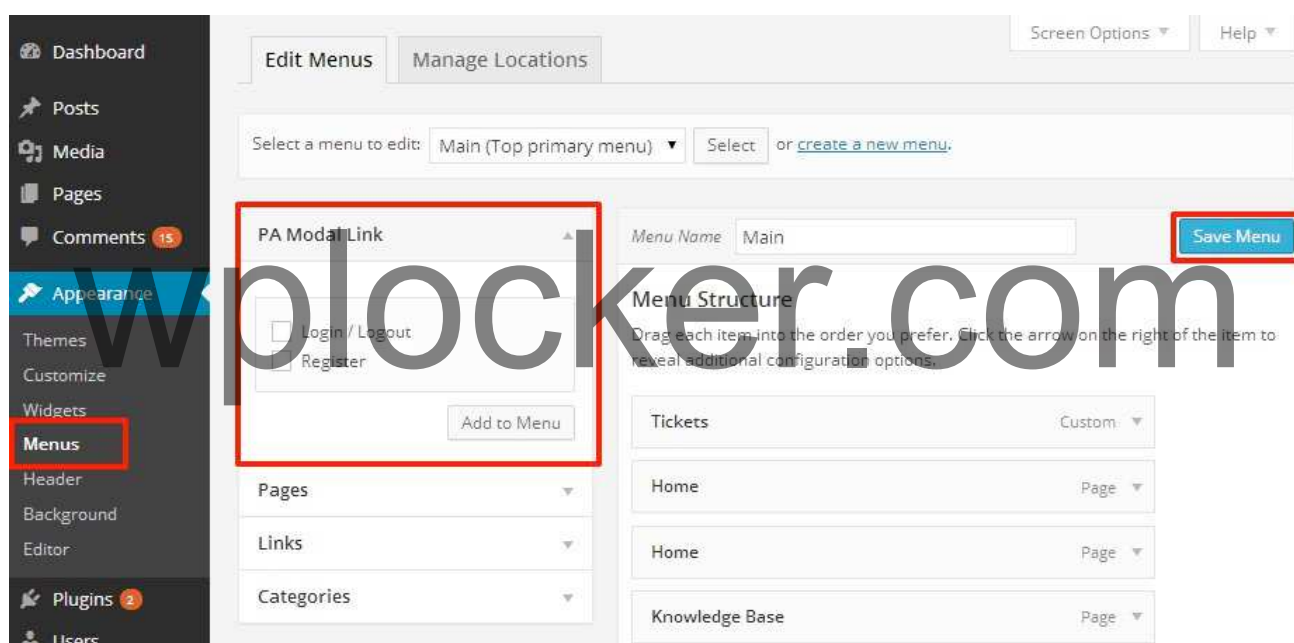
```
<?php pa_login(); ?>  
<?php pa_register(); ?>  
<?php pa_reset(); ?>
```

4 Modal Login

You can add modal links to you site using WP Menus, shortcodes, PHP functions.

4.1 WP Menus

In WP dashboard navigate to **Appearance > Menus > PA Modal Link**. Select **Login/Logout** and **Register** links, click add to menu and **Save Menu**.



4.2 Shortcodes

Add Modal links to a page using a shortcodes.

4.2.1 Modal Login form

[pa_modal_login]

The function accepts 2 optional arguments:

login_text The text for the login link, defaults to 'Login'.

logout_text The text for the logout link, default 'Logout'.

Example:

`[pa_modal_login login_text="Login" logout_text="Logout"]`

4.2.2. Modal Register form

[pa_modal_register]

The function accepts 2 optional arguments:

register_text The text for the register link, defaults to 'Register'.

registered_text The text for the registered link, default 'You are already registered'.

Example:

```
[pa_modal_register register_text="Register" registered_text="You are  
already registered"]
```

4.3 PHP Function

Add Modal Links to a page using PHP function

4.3.1 Modal Login Form

```
<?php pa_modal_login(); ?>
```

The function accepts 2 optional arguments:

\$login_text | String | The text for the login link, defaults to 'Login'.

\$logout_text | String | The text for the logout link, default 'Logout'.

Example:

```
<?php pa_modal_login ($login_text = 'Login', $logout_text = 'Logout'); ?>
```

4.3.2. Modal Register form

```
<?php pa_modal_register(); ?>
```

The function accepts 2 optional arguments:

\$register_text | String | The text for the register link, defaults to 'Register'.

\$registered_text | String | The text for the registered link, default 'You are already registered'.

Example:

```
<?php pa_modal_register ($register_text = 'register', $registered_text = 'You are allreadz registered'); ?>
```

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5 Profile Page

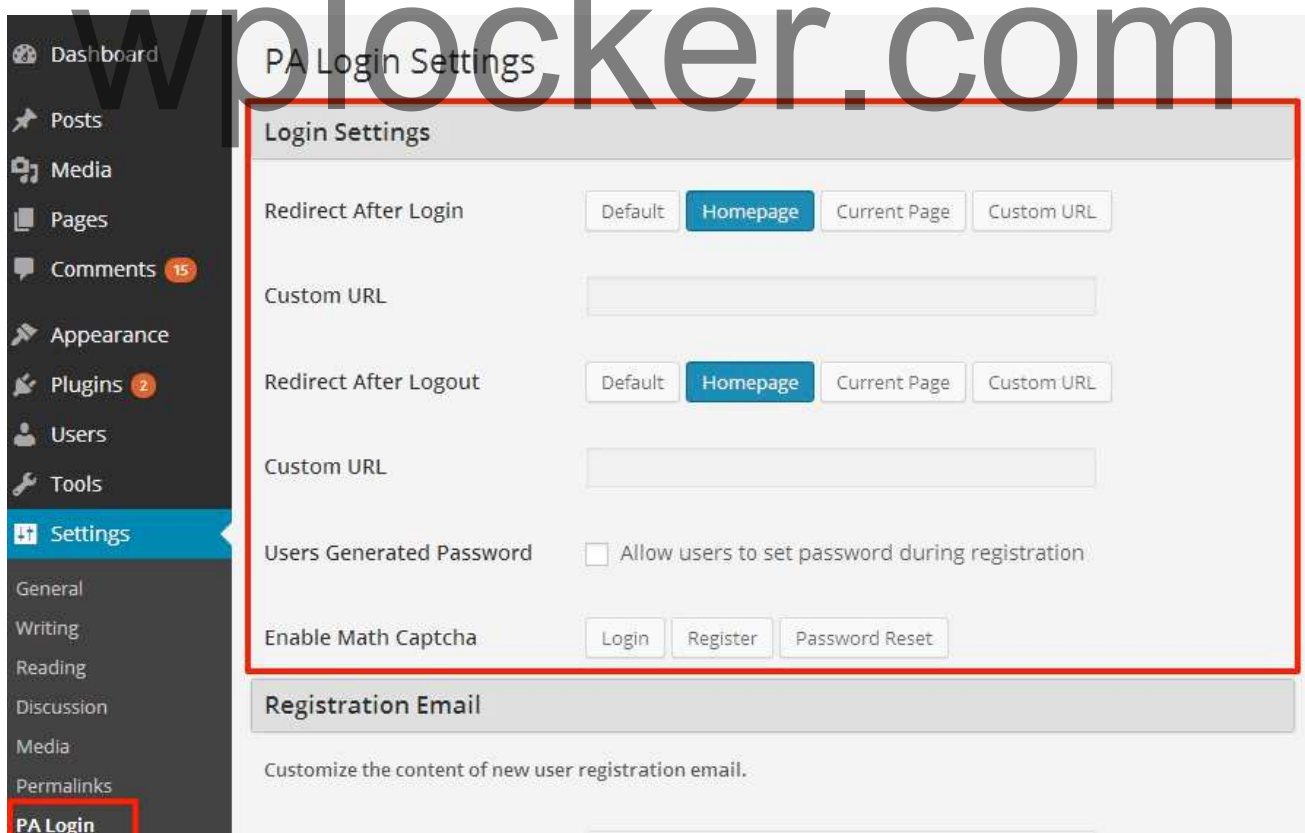
Add User Profile Form to a page using **[pa_profile]** or using PHP function

```
<?php pa_profile(); ?>
```

6 Plugin Settings

6.1 Login Settings

- **Redirect after Login** - set redirect URL after successful login.
- **Redirect after Logout** – set logout page redirect.
- **Users Generated Password** – allow users to set their own password during the registration.
- **Math Captcha** – require math captcha on login, register, forgotten forms.



6.2 Registration Email

Customise new user registration email template, use variables: %username%, %password%, %loginlink%. Leave blank to use default template.

Registration Email

Customize the content of new user registration email.

Subject:

Content: Add new user registration email template: %username%, %password%, %loginlink%. Leave blank to use default template

Your user name: %username%

Your password is: %password%

Your Login page is: %loginlink%

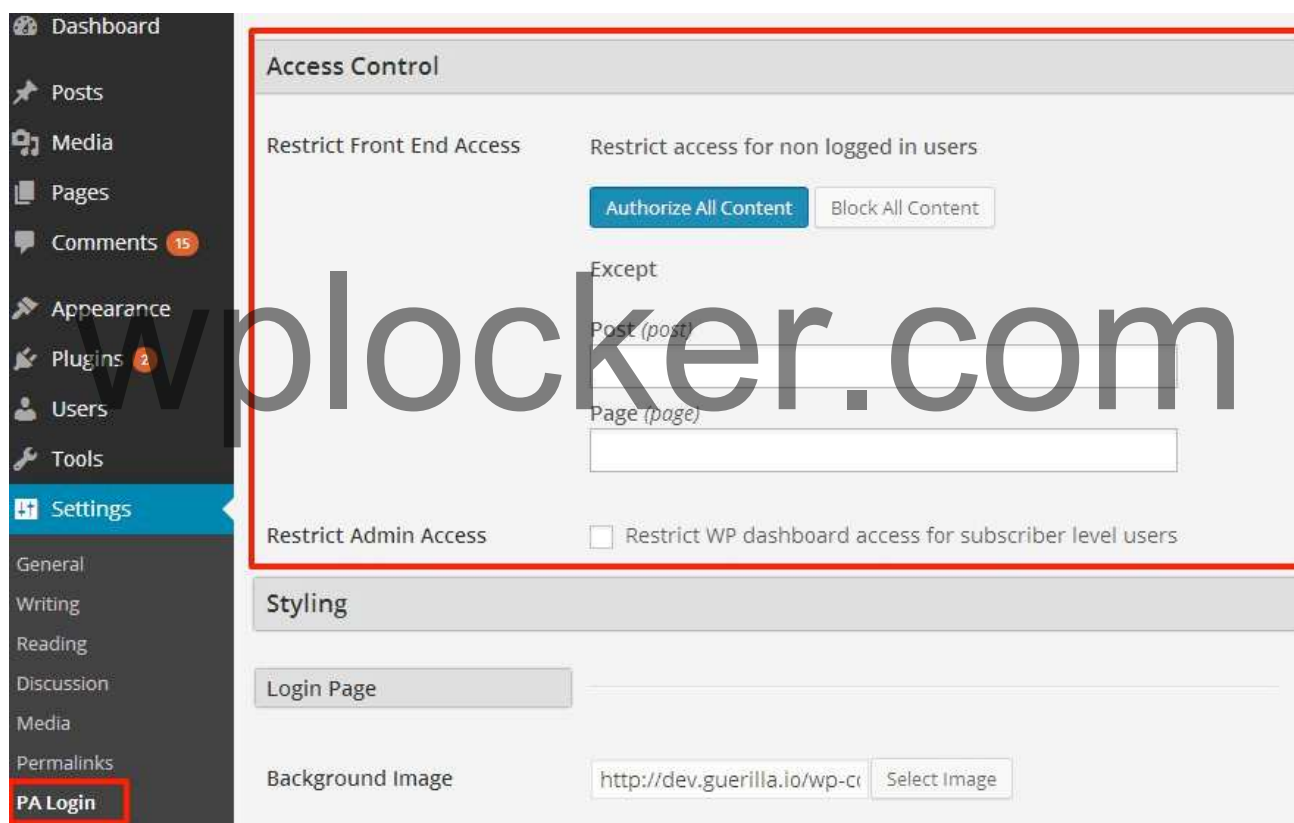
Restrict Front End Access:

6.3 Access Control

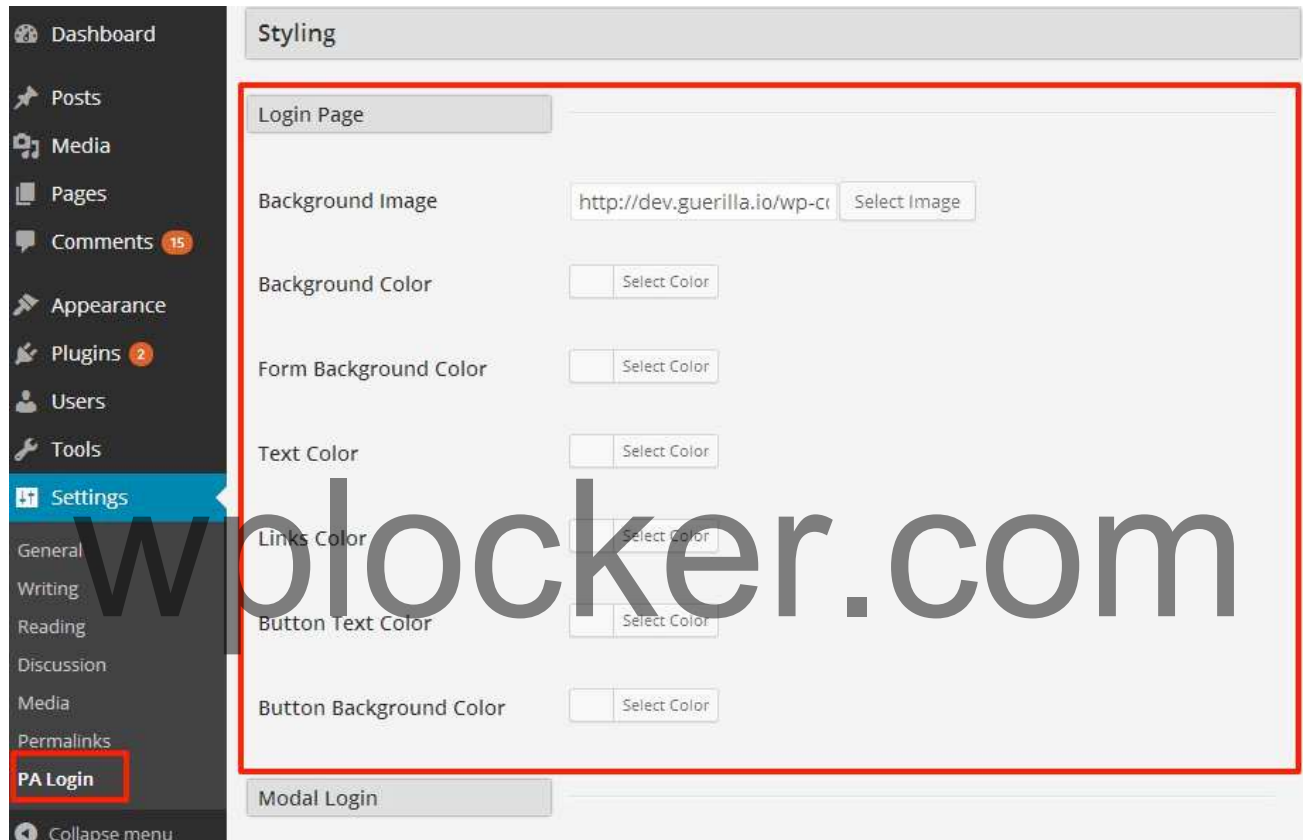
Front End – restrict front end Access for non logged in users. You can restrict Access entire site or selected posts, page, posts types, categories and taxonomies.

WP Dashboard – restrict WP dashboard Access for subscriber level users.

7 Translation

The theme is translation ready, please follow the steps bellow.

Download and install Poedit.

Open the program after the installation. Click **File > Open** and find the original pressapps.po file located in the "**lang**" directory in theme root.

Translate all the words to your language and save your translated file in the same ("lang") directory with "pressapps-" prefix followed by name of your language and country codes eg for Russian language "pressapps-ru_RU.po"

First parameter is a language code, second parameter is a country code.

Define the language in wp_config.php. The parameters must be the same as your *.po file name. With your language and country code.

```
define('WPLANG', 'ru_RU');
```
